DIRECTIONS

Driving - From DC

I-295 South to Capitol South; Capitol South to Suitland Parkway; Suitland Parkway to Stanton Road-turn Right; Stanton Road, South across Alabama Avenue, (two blocks) to Trenton Street, turn Left; Trenton Street, one block East to 19th Street, turn Right; 19th Street, one block South to Mississippi Avenue. The entrance and free parking area is straight ahead.

Public Transportation

Take the Green line Metro to the Anacostia Station. Exit to the RIGHT; up the escalator; Again to the RIGHT to the bus area. Take the Number 94 Metrobus "Anacostia Loop." It leaves the station promptly **on the hour** and **on the half-hour**. After a ten minute ride, you will arrive at Trenton and 19th Streets. When you get off the bus on Trenton Street, turn left for about 10 steps, then turn right and walk one block to Mississippi Avenue . The entrance will be straight ahead.

OR

Take the Green line to Southern Avenue Metro Station, walk north to Mississippi Ave., turn LEFT. Walk west on Mississippi to 19th Street, turn LEFT into the Entrance.
